Our Community Needs Your Help

With over 100 years of combined community service, and serving more than 500 families per year, Mechanicsburg Little League Association and Mechanicsburg Midget Football Association have embarked on a campaign to raise \$315,000.

Our baseball and football programs are working together to make our playing fields a great place to play and a great place to watch a game by building modern restroom facilities and a concession stand with a fully operating kitchen. Our programs are currently relying on an inadequate concession stand and portable restrooms that do not meet the needs of the players, families and spectators.

The organizations plan to have an increased ability to serve and sell concessions at the new building to support the building and better their programs. The building will also serve to support the community, as it will be able to be used for meetings for both organizations as well as be available for community meetings and small social events such as birthday parties. At the present time, both organizations have occasions throughout the year where they must pay to rent a facility for meetings, registrations or player evaluations. This is money that would stay within the organizations with the construction of this building.

Additionally, In order to stay competitive with other youth sports organizations in the area, our players need the benefit of an athletic facility that can be used year round. Many local athletes pay a significant amount of money to train in the off-season in local indoor training facilities. This is money that is lost to our organization because we do not have adequate facilities. By establishing our own indoor batting cages and workout area we can benefit our athletes, our programs and not send our valuable league funds elsewhere. With a facility such as the one we are building, our organizations would be providing a great service to the youth of our programs and community by establishing a safe place to improve their skills and engage in physical activity, especially during the colder months.
