

Until the first pitch is thrown the home coach decides if game can be played. Once the first pitch is thrown the game is in the umpire's hands.

All rainouts MUST be made up on the FIRST available OPEN date. We will NOT alter the pitching rules for any reason! This has gotten us in trouble in the past. If there is no open date prior to the next time the same two teams are scheduled they should try to start an hour early (if weekday game-or first game of weekend morning) for next meeting, finish the first game and then play the second. This will surely encourage coaches to work with more pitchers. It will also keep us from having games backed up to the end of the season and altering a bunch of things just so we can get to the playoffs.

How to decide if a game is playable:

1. Common Sense.
2. Field condition. If its puddly, muddy, slick, someone will sprain or break something. Rain itself isn't a real big problem-have plenty of baseballs and towels.
3. Lightning and Thunder: Little League (somewhere) has determined we should wait 15 mins (?) from last strike before resuming play, if at all.
4. Fun: Is it cold enough, wet enough, raw enough that it just won't be fun.

The League reserves the right to cancel any and all games without the coach(es) consent if we deem the field(s) unplayable. There may be instances when we'll deem one field playable and another not playable.
