Slow Play

If there was one thing all ParBoilers could agree on, it would be slow play. We, as in the ParBoilers, are known to play slow, collectively. That is to say some members are slower than others, while some are faster than others. We as an entity are only as fast as our slowest player, or group. We all want to take our time and play the best shot we can play so as to win a skin, make a putt, or get to the cart and drink more adult beverages. That being said, what are some things we all can do to help speed up play?

- 1) When two players are riding in a cart, drive the cart to the first ball and drop off the first player with his choice of clubs. The second player should proceed in the cart to his ball. After the first player hits his stroke, he should begin walking toward the cart as the second golfer is playing.
- 2) Begin reading the green and lining up putts as soon as you reach the green. Don't wait until it's your turn to putt to start the process of reading the green. Do it as soon as you reach the green so that when it's your turn you can step right up and putt.
- 3) Never delay making a stroke because you're having a conversation with a playing partner. Put the conversation on hold, make your stroke, then pick up the conversation again.
- 4) After putting out, don't stand around the green chatting or take any practice putting strokes. Leave the green quickly so the group behind can play. If there is no group behind, then a few practice putts are fine.
- 5) Mark your scorecard after reaching the next tee, not while lingering on or near the just-completed green.

I pulled these off the internet by typing in tips for slow play. There are 20 things I could have listed. I believe we are guilty of things that contribute to slow play at one point or another. Bottom line is try and be considerate of your fellow ParBoilers. By all means, take your time and enjoy your round of golf. **But be aware of your position behind the group in front of you. If you are behind do what is needed to catch up. Don't continue to stay behind!!**
