Trinity's Finn Named Longstreth/NFHCA Division III National Player of the Year

CHANDLER, Ariz. – Trinity College junior forward Kelcie Finn has been selected as the Longstreth/National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Division III National Player of the Year, it was announced on Monday.

Finn was previously named the Longstreth/NFHCA Division III New England West Region Player of the Year, and also earned the same honor in the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC). She totaled 27 goals and a school-record 68 points and led the nation in per game averages in both categories, with her 14 assists standing fifth in the country.

Finn also set school records with 138 shots and nine game-winning goals as she helped Trinity to a 13-5 record that included a trip to the second round of the NCAA Division III Field Hockey Championship. Finn made the New England West All-Region team for the third time in as many seasons at Trinity.

Finn becomes the second straight Division III National Player of the Year from a NESCAC school, following Bowdoin's Rachel Kennedy from 2015. Finn is also the first junior to receive the National Player of the Year award since Messiah's Julie Barton won the first of two consecutive honors in 2009.
